





Authoritarian and totalitarian regimes give rise to opposition and resistance, but the forms and possibilities of resistance within the respective countries are limited and associated with high risks. Protests in exile are therefore of particular significance.

There are numerous current and historical examples of protests by exiles but the form of the protests, their backgrounds, and their effectiveness are diverse.

The Summer Academy focuses on four main topics:

- Who, when and why: Current and historical reflections on mobilisation and protest in exile
- Globalisation and digitisation: Forms of protest through the ages
- Success, failure and repression: Consequences and effects of the exile protest in the country of origin
- Political challenges and possible actions for the countries of exile

We cover hotel fees, catering and travel expenses (in line with the German Travel Expense Act).

Who can apply?

We invite Master's students and PhD-candidates in the social sciences and humanities from Europe to engage with the role of protest in exile for regime-transformation and its implications for European foreign policy.
